Commissioner Michael DesRosier started by thanking the department heads present for the monthly meeting. There will be continued reviews of each department's budget. With no Old Business, the meeting went into New Business portion of the agenda.

II. New business;

a. Grant Opportunities – The commissioners stated now that Glacier County has a full time grant writer, the department heads need to look for grants that will benefit each department. Commissioner Rides At The Door added that your department can always add to your overall budget and benefit the department and county as a whole.

III. Department Updates:

a. DES – Charles Farmer: Farmer is currently working on the rough draft of the safety procedure. It is an ongoing project. He reminded the department heads that they are always welcome at the LEPC meetings and trainings.

b. Health Department – Carol McDivitt: McDivitt explained that all is well for the health department and she continues to work on the grant for the handicap access to the health department building.

c. Extension – Damon Bunting: The extension office is gearing up for the two local fairs this summer, Browning and Marias Fairs. The 4-H program is hoping that the new program in Browning takes off and is successful.

d. EMS – Amie Allison: The Glacier County EMS was requested to help out during Indian days in Browning during the rodeo and we offered our services if needed.

The county has a busy month ahead. The commissioners thanked the department heads for taking time out of their busy schedule to keep them informed of the day to day business taking place in Glacier County.

10:00 a.m. Discussion/Approval: Purchase of Conveyer – Road Department

Bandel, Road Supervisor had previously discussed purchasing a conveyer. Commissioner Tony Sitzmann motioned to approve the Road Departments purchase of a conveyer for the amount of \$16,500.00. Commissioner Ron Rides At The Door seconds the motion and the board unanimously in favor of the motion, the motion then carried.

The road department uses a GPS until that is connected to the sprayer. Bandel explained that the system is getting old and hard to find parts. The new systems have monthly charges, but with those charges you automatically receive reports regarding the work completed with the system. He is looking into replacing the county's current system.

10:30 a.m. Discussion/Approval: Truck Purchase – Road Department

Bill Bandel spoke with the commission regarding the truck the road department would like to purchase for \$29,500. After refreshing the commissioner's memories, Commissioner Tony Sitzmann motioned to approve the road department purchase of an International truck for \$29,500. Commissioner Ron Rides At The Door seconds the motion; the board of commissioners was all in favor, the motion carried.

The time frame to correct the issues is not feasible at this time. Commissioner Rides At The Door gave the Coe's Sanitarian Ron Anderson's information in order for them to set up a meeting with him. Anderson may be able to help in ways that the commission can't. Commissioner DesRosier also suggested to the Coe's that they talk to the Cut Bank Development Corporation and/or the Cut Bank Area Chamber of Commerce for support.

Sheriff Wayne Dusterhoff presented the commissioner with June 2010's monthly report.

4:00 p.m. Approval of Minutes
